#### **BLESSINGS FROM DEXTER**

Dear Ones:

The Way Forward...that's the title I gave to this year's Easter Season sermon series for the weeks from the Sunday after Easter (April 23) through Trinity Sunday (June 16). This covers the period following the resurrection until Luke's account of the coming of the Spirit on Pentecost and then Trinity Sunday. For the modern church, this is the period in which we recall the appearances of Jesus to His disciples before he ascended in heaven, 40 days during which he helped them gain greater understanding about what the coming of the Kingdom meant for them then and what that would mean for them in the future. He promised them that after he was gone, the Holy Spirit would come to teach and guide them which we celebrate on Pentecost Sunday. We will conclude this season of the church year on Trinity Sunday, when we celebrate the mystery of the Triune God, the One God who is experienced as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.

The Sunday after Trinity Sunday begins a different season -- June 23 designated as the Second Sunday after Pentecost or the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time or Proper 7, depending on which designation system is used. That numbering will progress through November 17. November 24th will be Christ the King Sunday and then December 1 will be the 1st Sunday of Advent -- the first Sunday of a new liturgical year. How's that for a minilesson on our church calendar?

But for me, and I hope for all of us, what all those designations represent is the fact that our faith keeps moving forward; that each new Sunday and each new season are opportunities to gain new insight and appreciation for this Amazing Grace of God that comes to us through Christ; and that each day of our lives the Spirit can nudge us toward more faithfully living in ways that shine forth God's light and love and hope.

As we move into summer, our schedules and our routines may change...vacation trips, perhaps seeing family and friends we haven't seen in some time, perhaps having to deal with new challenges. And though what we call the church season or what we call a particular Sunday will vary, what doesn't change is the assurance that the Holy God who has been with us through all our past seasons and days will be right with us through all or todays and all our tomorrows. Thanks be to God!

### **MISSIONS – TERRI BACON**



Someone asked me a few weeks ago when we will start requesting donations for one of their favorite mission projects. It got me thinking about two things: First -what a generous congregation we have! And then I wondered how many people know the process Session uses as we try to answer the call to serve others. So – for your generosity - Thank you!

The answer to the question about process begins when the congregation makes its pledges. Then

a church budget is approved by Session. Part of that budget includes an amount designated for missions. The Mission Committee then considers the possibilities and allocates money to projects approved by Session. This year that amount is \$7,700.

As you can imagine, \$7,700 doesn't cover everything, so we prayerfully consider our choices. Money wings its way to Presbyterian World Missions, to Mission coworkers Jeff and Christi Boyd in Africa, and to the Elk Grove winter shelter program.

In other cases, we combine money from our pledged offerings with extra giving. We will give \$500 to the food bank this year and supplement that with our First Sunday gifts of bags of food. We have allocated \$1,000 for our high school under construction in Honduras. That will be supplemented with another \$2,000 from our Pick a Brick envelope giving and money received from the Triumphant Quartet concert. We have set aside \$250 for the Armenian Kindergarten and will combine that with money we retain from the Presbyterian Peace offering.

We will use money we retain from the Presbyterian Pentecost offering (40%) to buy school supplies. Some of you just can't help yourselves though and want to pitch in to help with that. At Christmas we will have set aside money to adopt a family, but once again, some of you get great pleasure out of shopping for the family. We welcome those contributions too.

Our \$1,000 2019 EGPC Elk Grove Scholarship was funded entirely by extra gifts from the congregation last year. We anticipate the same thing will happen again next year. (continued next page)...

### **ISRAEL – AN AMAZING EXPERIENCE: SHARON CHILCOAT**

What do you picture when you think of Israel? Dry deserts, flat terrain? I was amazed when we landed in Tel Aviv and it looked like we were back in California along the Monterey coast. It was beautiful and green. Now I fully understand why our climate is called Mediterranean.

There were 29 of us from the Elk Grove and University Presbyterian Churches. We started our trip in Tel Aviv and followed the Mediterranean coast northward and then turned inland to Lake Galilee also known as Tiberias. There we visited the sites where Jesus grew up and began his ministry. From there we traveled south following the River Jordan to the Dead Sea. These areas were drier and more desert like. From there we went to Jerusalem where we stayed 5 days. Jerusalem is a very large city built on hills and heavily populated. Here and in the surrounding areas we visited the places where so much of Jesus' ministry took place including his birth, death and resurrection.

Seeing Israel and the places where Jesus lived and ministered has enriched my reading of the Bible. If you have the opportunity to go to Israel, go! It was an amazing experience.

Every Sunday, at EGPC, we reaffirm our faith using the *Apostles' Creed* or a brief statement of faith. The affirmation of faith is when we declare what it is we believe.

It is also of concern that we are often near our capacity for Sunday morning services. Our attendance has slowly been creeping up which is a great thing. However, we are slowly running out of seats.


