Elk Grove Presbyterian Church Elk Grove Winter Shelter in Place Program (EGWINSIP) Status Update

Hi EGPC Family,

This is Mike Van De Pol. I hope everyone is happy, healthy and safe holiday season. I just wanted to provide you with a status update of the EGWINSIP Program, in which our church is participating in.

If you recall, each year our church participates in the worthwhile program called Elk Grove Winter Sanctuary (EGWINS). In this program, churches help homeless people in our community with food, shelter, clothing, support, transportation and fellowship during the tough winter months. Elk Grove Presbyterian Church has been a very active participant in all aspects of this program over the years.

This year, due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, changes had to be made in the program. The program could no longer offer the over-night shelter arrangements, transportation and food distribution benefits previously afforded. In order to continue service the homeless in our community, the program was changed.

The new program is called the Elk Grove Winter Shelter in Place Program (EGWINSIP). In this new program, lunches are prepared by program volunteers at a host church each week. These lunches are delivered to the homeless in our community by program volunteer drivers. Homeless encampments throughout our area have been identified and placed into specific routes for the drivers. In addition to lunches, other helpful supplies may be delivered to the clients on occasion. In this way, the new program can serve the homeless effectively, given the pandemic constraints.

The EGWINSIP Program runs for 6 months. It started on October 5th (Monday) and continues to the first of April. Each Monday morning, lunches are prepared by program volunteers at the host church, which is Elk Grove Presbyterian Church. The lunches are then given to the volunteer drivers for distribution, through the week. Each week over 200 meals are distributed to homeless in our community, through this program. In addition to lunches, the program provides care packages composed of health items, sanitation items, hygiene items, and comfort items such as shoes, hats, gloves, coats, sleeping bags, shelter bags, tarps, blankets and more. We have distributed holiday treats, gift coupons and even a bike.

This program so far has been a great success and much appreciated by the clients. So far we are about half way through the program duration and everything seems to be running smoothly. A special thanks goes out to our church and the many volunteers who have stepped up to help in this program. We can be very proud as a congregation, knowing that we are active in helping the less fortunate in our community. In the near future I will be requesting further assistance from our congregation in making care packages. Keep a look out for more details to come.
